




The Widening Racial Wealth Gap, 1984 – 2009 (\$1=R9.2)





Key Drivers of the Increasing Racial Wealth Gap





Unequal Wealth Growth

	White Wealth Growth*	Black Wealth Growth
Each \$1 in Income Increase Yields	\$5.19	.69
Each \$1 of Inheritance Yields	.91	.20
Each \$1 in Family Financial Support Yields	.35	.51
Years of Homeownership	No Significant Impact	Significant Impact
Marriage	Significant Impact	No Significant Impact

^{*}Regression estimates at the median change in wealth over the 25-year study period conducted separately for white and black households
